Not be the subject of any pending criminal investigation case;

Not be the respondent of any No Contact Order or Protection Order

The sponsoring law enforcement agencies seek to fill the Citizens' Academy session with a cross section of the community.

You will be notified by the sponsoring agency if you are accepted into the academy.
